### 2006 HIGHLIGHTS

- The annual update meeting for Chicagoland supporters was held in January 2006.
- "Child's Gate to Learning" voted to support a 10<sup>th</sup> center, the "Vilties vėrinėliai" (Strings of Hope) center in Žemaičių Kalvarija.
- Officers visited a number of the supported centers in Lithuania—one spent several months, volunteering at a Vilnius center and completing various projects.
- A seminar was sponsored again in Kaunas for supported center directors, staff, and volunteers. A new film was made by documentary filmmaker Agnè Marcinkevičiūtė to show highlights from the seminar and features short interviews with some of the organizers and attendees.
- Three Lithuanian-speaking young Americans worked as volunteers in Lithuania at two different "Child's Gate to Learning" supported centers. Two worked in Marijampole and one worked in Vilnius.
- An editorial committee completed the fourth character building program.
- Financial support for special projects was sought and received from various associations.
- Fund-raising events were held throughout the year.
- Officers' elections were held.
- There were 4 members' meetings, 6 officers' meetings, 1 Board of Directors' meeting and a number of special project meetings.

#### IN LITHUANIA

#### Centers

"Child's Gate to Learning" supports and maintains contact with 10 after school centers and temporary shelters (dienos centrai & laikinosios globos namai) in various cities and towns of Lithuania: Vilnius (2), Kazlų Rūda, Marijampolė, Naujoji Akmenė, Obeliai, Rumbonys, Užpaliai, and the two most recently supported- in Kaunas and Žemaičių Kalvarija.

"Child's Gate to Learning" has great admiration for the work of center directors, staff, and volunteers at all 10 supported centers. Most of the children who attend the centers are from socially and economically disadvantaged families. At the centers, children: find respite from their chaotic family lives, are treated with respect, are supervised as they do homework, are provided with meals and school supplies, are taken on field trips, go to summer camp, celebrate birthdays and holidays, and learn life skills they perhaps are not learning at home. Some centers have established programs to work with the mothers of the children, or with younger preschool siblings. Center directors train staff, recruit, and prepare volunteers to effectively work with the children.

Several officers visited the Zaliakalnis center in Kaunas (support began in late 2005) where the Franciscan sisters work with regular center attendees, needy children from the neighborhood. The center is open during the school year and during summer afternoons.

"Child's Gate to Learning" voted to support the "Vilties vėrinėliai" (Strings of hope) center in Žemaičių Kalvarija, located in the northwestern corner of Lithuania (not far from Plungė). The center co-directors successfully recruited their colleagues from the nearby school, to help out after school during the school year and at weeklong summer day camps organized for the children. The center's facilities can only accommodate about 25 children at one time. In order to work with the children who have need of the center's services, some children attend on alternate days. A center-based Lithuanian ethnographic ensemble is being formed (and we helped find funding for musical instruments). The center celebrated its 1<sup>st</sup> birthday in the fall of 2006. Happy Birthday!

Supported center directors, staff, and volunteers from 9 of the 10 supported centers gathered in Kaunas once again for a weekend seminar in May 2006. They were introduced to the new program, attended talks given by psychology and social work professionals. They had the opportunity to network with colleagues, shared stories and experiences. A Lithuanian language documentary film, "Žingsniai į prasmingą gyvenimą" (Steps Towards a Meaningful Life) was produced by filmmaker *Agnė Marcinkevičiūtė* to record highlights of the seminar and its impact on attendees. #### Volunteers

High-school age volunteers, *Lina Jarašius* (from Denver, *CO*) and *Nida Vidutis* (from Tacoma Park, Maryland) went to Lithuania in June and worked as volunteers at the "Šaltinelis" (Little Fountain) center in Marijampole. The center is a temporary shelter for children who were removed by police from chaotic family crises. The volunteers played with the children, went with them on outings, worked with them arts and crafts projects, planted a garden, and taught the children a bit of English as well!

In the fall of 2006, adult volunteer, educator, actress, and director, Chicagoan Audrė Budrys-Nakas worked at the "Vilties Angelas" (Angel of Hope) center in Vilnius. Over the course of several months, she conducted acting exercises and drama workshops for the children, and she produced a Christmas play in which the children showed what they had learned.

## Character Building Program

In early 2006, a special editorial committee worked on the newest character building program "Žingsniai į prasminga gyvenimą" (Steps Towards a Meaningful Life). The program, designed for 13-17 year olds, is the fourth organization-provided program developed by Lithuanian-American teachers and social workers for the supported centers in Lithuania. The new program emphasizes family life, positive personal and professional goals. Like the other programs, its techniques include the use of games, skits, discussions, plays, songs, stories, but not lectures!
